Maria Droste Counseling Center provides accessible, community-centered, high quality mental health counseling and clinical training. We serve those seeking healthier lives, regardless of ability to pay. We are a Denver-based nonprofit mental health service organization comprised of mental health professionals, learners and volunteers who are passionate about community, learning, and service. Our uniquely sustainable model of traditional and co-located mental health counseling and clinical training is delivered in collaboration with a group of expert private clinicians. We train the next generation of mental health therapists and provide mental health counseling services to Coloradans at our Center, via telehealth, and where people live and receive care. We serve individuals of all ages and backgrounds, including children and adolescents, older adults, survivors of domestic violence, and more.

Job Summary: This position will support our growing need for counseling services for Coloradans receiving outpatient medical services with our partners. Clients represent diverse backgrounds, ages, and may receive services at a variety of settings within the agency. This position includes in person and telehealth counseling services. This position requires high quality of treatment services and evidence based assessment and intervention, alongside coordination of care with other healthcare professionals. Responsibilities include supervision of one or more advanced graduate or postgraduate trainees, and some case management, with attention to whole person care. Ability to work autonomously but also well in small team environments is critical. As is strong ethical and clinical skills, ability to manage and maintain a required caseload, and flexibility to adapt and communicate in multiple settings.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Direct Clinical Services (75%): Individual and group counseling, case management
- Program and Training (15%): Providing training and consulting on program development.
- Clinical Supervision (10%): Supervising graduate or postgraduate level therapists

Knowledge, Skills & Abilities:

- Experience providing counseling and crisis intervention treatment to clients.
- Experience providing behavioral healthcare services in a medical or housing setting or experience coordinating care with other health care and paraprofessionals. .
- Sensitivity to and committed growth toward multicultural competency.

- Passion for working in a non-profit setting, developing new programs and service lines, nurturing clinicians and advancing the mental health workforce for underserved populations.
- Outgoing, innovative clinicians who are comfortable with outreach efforts required; working effectively both independently and as part of a team.
- Experience working in an electronic health record, and learning new systems.
- Current Medicaid/Medicare or eligible providers preferred.

Education & Credentials:

- MA or doctorate degree in Social Work, and LCSW in the state of Colorado
- Licensed Clinical Social Worker or eligibility within 6 months of start date
- Other license types such as PhD/PsyD, LPC, LMFT may be considered
